Epiphany Scripture Lesson

Matthew 2:1-12 "The Magi, the Star, The Child"

Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him. When Herod the king had heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, "And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, art not the least among the princes of Judah: for out of thee shall come a Ruler, that shall rule my people Israel." Then Herod, when he had secretly called the wise men, inquired of them diligently what time the star appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when you have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also. When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy. And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh. and being warned by God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.





Epistle Romans 6:1–11

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.




Holy Gospel Matthew 3:13–17

who proceeds from the Father and the Son,


who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.

Sermon

"Righteousness: Fulfilled"

TEXT: Matt. 3:13-17 DATE: January 8, 2023 LITURGICAL DAY: The Baptism of Our Lord

THEME: Jesus fulfilled all righteousness to make you righteous in your baptism.

- I. Jesus identified with sinners by submitting to the baptism of John.
 - II. The presence of the Holy Trinity testifies Jesus sanctified the waters of Baptism to give you His righteousness.
- III. As one baptized into Christ, you are beloved and well-pleasing to God in His Son.

CONCLUSION: Our Prophet, Priest, and King was manifest at Jordan's stream. (*LSB 394*) Today He comes to all the baptized with the promise He is the Prophet, the fulfillment of all prophecy and righteousness, the High Priest of our atonement by His blood, and the King Who reigns in glory with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Clothed with Christ's righteousness in your baptism, you are beloved in the Beloved and well-pleasing to God by your baptism into the body of His Son, with Whom you are resurrected to life. To Him be glory forever. Amen.
