"THE BOAT OF THE CHURCH"

TEXT: Luke 5:1-11 DATE: 2-9-25

LITURGICAL DAY: 5th Sunday after the Epiphany

Theme:

Christians are in the boat of the church, because we have been caught by the net of the Word of God, which we have heard from the preaching of Jesus Christ./

I. JESUS PREACHED THE WORD OF GOD FROM A BOAT

II. JESUS GAVE A LARGE CATCH OF FISH TO SIMON, JAMES & JOHN

III. JESUS CALLS HIS DISCIPLES TO CATCH MEN – The People of Mankind

CONCLUSION:

We sit in the "nave" of the church (nave is the Latin word for boat),
because the baptismal net has pulled us from the waters of death,
because preaching and teaching and absolution have placed us into the church boat,
because holy communion feeds us with the captain of the boat Jesus' body and blood.

From the "pulpit" at the prow front of the boat / church - we listen to the Word of God!
