Hebrews 5:1–10

¹Every high priest chosen from among men is appointed to act on behalf of men in relation to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ²He can deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is beset with weakness. ³Because of this he is obligated to offer sacrifice for his own sins just as he does for those of the people. ⁴And no one takes this honor for himself, but only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

⁵So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed by him who said to him,

"You are my Son, today I have begotten you";

being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, ¹⁰being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchizedek.



Mark 10:32-45

But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. ⁴⁵For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Sermon

"JESUS CHRIST REWROTE GOD'S COVENANT"

Theme: Jesus Christ rewrote God's covenant according to God's will.

- I. JESUS DID NOT COME SEEKING GLORY BUT TO SERVE AND TO SUFFER FOR US.
- II. JESUS CALLS US TO BE DISCIPLINED IN THE GIFTS HE GIVES US THROUGH HIS SERVICE AND SUFFERING.

III. IN DISCIPLINE, WE OUGHT TO READY OURSELVES TO SUFFER FOR GOD AND SERVE HIS PEOPLE.

CONCLUSION: Receive Christ's gifts—the means by which He confers the benefits of His suffering on us and share those gifts with your neighbor.






Preface


- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.



Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins.


