




Salutation and Collect of the Day


Holy Gospel Matthew 28:1–10

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-eighth chapter.



¹Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. ²And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. ⁴And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. ⁵But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. 
I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.



TITLE OF SERMON:

"Go Quickly and Tell that Jesus is Risen from the Dead!"

TEXT: Matthew 28:1-10 / Colossians 3:1-4 DATE: 4-9-23 LITURGICAL DAY: The Festival of the Resurrection of our Lord - Easter Sunday *Theme: Jesus arose just as he told his disciples he would.*All the promises he has made to us are true! Believe his words!

I. JESUS CHRIST - CRUCIFIED AND BURIED

II. JESUS CHRIST - RISEN FROM THE DEAD

III. IN JESUS CHRIST - YOU TOO WILL BE RAISED

CONCLUSION: Because Jesus, in fact, is risen from the dead, the joy of Easter knows no bounds, but overflows into all of life. We rejoice in Jesus, the resurrection and the life. He is our justification and atoning sacrifice. We live the baptismal life connected to his death, burial and resurrection in our daily vocations.

We hear and study his Word, we pray daily, we are absolved and we commune with him at his holy table. His promises to us are all true: Forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are ours into eternity!

We join in the ancient church's Easter proclamation:

Pastor: "The Lord is risen!" People: "He is risen indeed!" (3 times)

All: "Hallelujah! Amen!"

Amen.


