Sermon

"Jesus, Our Lord and God"
TEXT: John 20:19-31

- I. Jesus rose from the dead as our Lord and God.
II. The resurrected Christ gives gifts to His Church.
III. The Church bears witness to our Lord's divinity and resurrection.

Conclusion: In our Gospel account St. Thomas, failed to believe the witness of his fellow disciples when they said that they had seen the resurrected Christ. But, when He saw the wounds of Christ, He cried out, "my Lord and my God." Because Jesus' wounds are proof that He rose from the dead and overcame death and the devil through the cross, now we continue to bear witness to that the resurrected Christ is "our Lord and our God" who is "faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." That is the Gospel that the Church proclaims to the entire world.
