Reading

L A reading from Acts, chapter 10.

³⁴Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

⁴⁴While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. ⁴⁵And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. ⁴⁶For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. 
L A reading from John, chapter 15.

Sermon

"CHOSEN TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER"

5-5-24 TEXT: John 15:9-17 LITURGICAL DAY: The Sixth Sunday of Easter

Theme: Jesus inaugurates a new kind of love, a friendship that sacrifices oneself for another.

I. THE FATHER LOVED THE SON AND GAVE HIM AS A SACRIFICE FOR THE SINS OF THE WORLD.

II. THE SON CHOSE US AS HIS FRIENDS AND LAID DOWN HIS LIFE FOR US.

III. THE SON CHOSE YOU TO LAY DOWN YOUR LIFE FOR YOUR FRIENDS THAT YOU MAY TAKE IT UP AGAIN.

CONCLUSION: Jesus looses us from the bonds of servanthood so that we might be free to abide in His love and to love one another.


HOLY COMMUNION POLICY:




ATTENDANCE AND COMMUNION REGISTRATION:
