TITLE OF THE SERMON: "JESUS' VICTORY, SUFFERING, AND PRAYER"

TEXT: John 16:23-33 DATE: 5-25-25 LITURGICAL DAY: Sixth Sunday of Easter Theme: Christ's suffering and death is the basis for confidently approaching the throne of the Father in faithful prayer.

I. SUFFERING AND TRIBULATION AS BASELINE EXPERIENCE FOR HUMANITY

II. THE INVITATION TO PRAY TO THE FATHER DIRECTLY AS RESPONSE TO SUFFERING

III. CHRIST OVERCOMING THE SINFUL WORLD AS THE BASIS FOR CONFIDENT PRAYER

CONCLUSION:

Jesus promises sorrow now. Jesus identifies the common experience of mankind – suffering and hardship. The disciples think they understand Jesus, but their faith is still inadequate. They did not truly understand Jesus until they passed through the hardship and fear of watching Jesus suffer and die, and then rise from the dead and ascend. In that trial God perfected their faith, and firmly established them in the peace and confidence of those who belong to Christ Jesus. Because of His resurrection, we too have peace and joy that no one can take from us. Because of Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension, we can confidently approach the heavenly Father as our Father when we are in need or want or tribulation or suffering. We can ask because the Father loves us who loved His Son and believed in Him.


