## The Old Testament

*Numbers 11:24–30*

**L** A reading from Numbers, chapter 11.

<sup>24</sup>Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. <sup>25</sup>Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. ## The Epistle

*Acts 2:1–21*

**L** A reading from Acts, chapter 2.

<sup>1</sup>When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup>And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup>And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. <sup>4</sup>And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

<sup>5</sup>Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. <sup>6</sup>And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. <sup>7</sup>And they were amazed and astonished, saying, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup>And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? <sup>9</sup>Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup>Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, <sup>11</sup>both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.” <sup>12</sup>And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” <sup>13</sup>But others mocking said, “They are filled with new wine.”

<sup>14</sup>But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words.  
<sup>15</sup>For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day.  
<sup>16</sup>But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:

<sup>17</sup>““And in the last days it shall be, God declares,  
that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh,  
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,  
and your young men shall see visions,  
and your old men shall dream dreams;

<sup>19</sup>And I will show wonders in the heavens above  
and signs on the earth below,

and the moon to blood,  
before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day.

## Sermon

### “Tuned by the Spirit”

TEXT: Acts 2:1-21      DATE: May 28, 2023

LITURGICAL DAY: The Day of Pentecost

THEME: The Holy Spirit tunes the ears of all nations to hear the word of God.

**I. The Holy Spirit speaks the word of God in the tongues of all nations.**

**II. God speaks to His people by His appointed means.**

CONCLUSION: Verse 21 says, “*everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.*” The Holy Spirit blows the word of God to people from every nation of the earth. He speaks by means determined by Him with the purpose of giving salvation to all who call upon the name of the Lord. Prophecy received in the Spirit always tunes our ears to hear of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, in Whom is our salvation. For, Christ is risen! (**He is risen indeed! Alleluia!**) All glory and honor be to the Holy Spirit, Who with the Father and + Son together is worshiped and reigns forevermore. Amen.
