P The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the fourth chapter.



TEXT: Mark 4:35-41 LITURGICAL DAY: 4th Sunday after Pentecost / Father's Dau Date: June 20, 2021

THEME: Jesus who calmed the wind and the waves with his word says to us: "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

Amen.


Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins.


