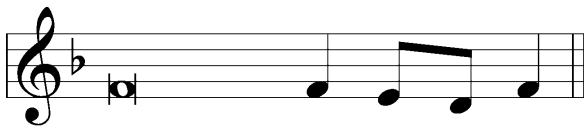
## Lord's Prayer

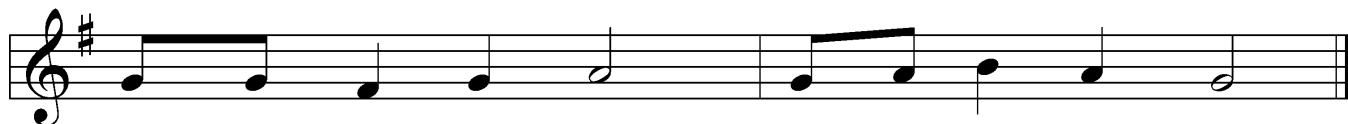
