

Genesis 18:20-33








SERMON

"HOW TO PRAY..."

TEXT Luke 11:1-13 DATE: 7-24-22 LITURGICAL DAY: 7th Sunday after Pentecost

Theme: Jesus teaches us the "Our Father"- the Lord's Prayer. Here we are given the words and shown how to speak our prayers. Three illustrations of what prayer before God is like are described here by Jesus:

I. BOLDNESS TO ASK FOR BREAD AT MIDNIGHT

II. KNOCKING AT THE DOOR TO BE OPENED

III. ASKING FOR GOOD GIFTS FROM OUR FATHER IN HEAVEN

CONCLUSION: God speaks to us in His Word, and gives us the gifts of forgiveness of sins, life and salvation through preaching, baptizing, absolving and communing. He does this through the work of the Holy Spirit in our hearts through these means of grace.

We now speak to Him in prayers and bring our praises, requests, supplications and thanksgivings before His throne of grace- both individually and as a congregation.

Review the introduction, 7 petitions and conclusion of the Lord's Prayer and the explanations in the Small Catechism, LSB pp. 323-325.

This is both a pattern for the simple prayer itself, and also an outline for the daily prayer life!





The pastor and those who assist him receive the body and blood of Christ first and then distribute them to those who come to receive, saying:


