Epistle - Romans 11:1-2a, 13-15, 28-32

¹I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. ²God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew. . . ¹³Now I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I am an apostle to the Gentiles, I magnify my ministry ¹⁴in order somehow to make my fellow Jews jealous, and thus save some of them. ¹⁵For if their rejection means the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance mean but life from the dead? .

²⁸As regards the gospel, they are enemies of God for your sake. Holy Gospel- Matthew 15:21-28


P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew the 15th chapter.

"CRYING OUT TO JESUS"

TEXT: Matthew 15:21-28 DATE: 8-16-20 LITURGICAL DAY: 11th Sunday after Pentecost THEME: What does it mean for you to cry out to Jesus to have mercy on you and to have a great faith in our Lord Jesus Christ?

I. BELIEVING THAT JESUS IS THE "SON OF DAVID" FOR THE JEWS

"Lord have mercy - The Kyrie"

II. BELIEVING THAT JESUS IS THE "LORD" ALSO FOR THE GENTILES "Lord just give me crumbs"

"Lord give me mercy and faith" CONCLUSION:

Like the Canaanite woman from Tyre and Sidon

(whose daughter was healed from the terrible suffering of demon-possession), we cry out to for mercy Jesus and kneel before Him and make our earnest requests. He will grant our requests according to His holy will, which is always the best for us!







Amen.


