TITLE OF THE SERMON:

"JESUS, THE FOUNT OF EVERY BLESSING"

TEXT: Mark 7:31-37 DATE: 08-28-24

LITURGICAL DAY: 16th Sunday after Pentecost

Theme: The Incarnate Word, Our Merciful Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, Does All Things Well

I. THE WORD GIVES US HEARING

II. THE WORD GIVES US SPEECH

III. THE WORD GIVES US LOVE ABUNDANT

CONCLUSION:

Jesus Christ loosed the tongue of the mute, gave hearing to the deaf, and imparts His divine love to all He has called to Himself. The Word imputes faith to the faithless. To the natural man who will not hear the things of God, He in mercy pierces their deafness and says, "Ephphatha." He has given us speech by His Word, the source of speech, to praise, thank, honor and confess Him. Love such as this inevitably overflows from the hearts of those that belong to Him, pouring out into thought, word, and deed, so that we may love those who God also loves. All that He gives is toward our eternal salvation.
