Old Testament Reading

Ezekiel 34:11–24

¹¹"For thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I, I myself will search for my sheep and will seek them out. ¹²As a shepherd seeks out his flock when he is among his sheep that have been scattered, so will I seek out my sheep, and I will rescue them from all places where they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³And I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land. And I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the ravines, and in all the inhabited places of the country. ¹⁴I will feed them with good pasture, and on the mountain heights of Israel shall be their grazing land. ³So he told them this parable: ⁴"What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? ⁵And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. ⁶And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' ⁷Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

TITLE OF THE SERMON:

"The Joy of Finding"

TEXT: Luke 15:1-10 DATE: September 11, 2022 LITURGICAL DAY: 14th Sunday after Pentecost

THEME: Jesus finds all repentant sinners and brings them home with joy.

I. Repentant sinners draw near to hear the Word of God but the self-righteous grumble at the voice of the Shepherd.

II. The Word of God searches for lost sheep and bears them home on His own shoulders with rejoicing.

III. The Church diligently seeks the lost and receives repentant sinners with joy.

CONCLUSION: Finding something lost on this earth brings a brief moment of joy. But the overwhelming joy of repentant sinners found by the one Shepherd and His Church is never-ending. The joy of finding is eternal. Jesus, our Shepherd, rejoices to bring us all the way home with Him to heaven above. As was written by Isaiah the prophet: "The ransomed of the Lord shall return and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain gladness and joy." (Is. 51:11)


HOLY COMMUNION POLICY:


Lord's Prayer
