¹Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God according to the promise of the life that is in Christ Jesus,

²To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

³I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with joy. ⁵I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. ⁶For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, ⁷for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that Day what has been entrusted to me. ¹³Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴By the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, guard the good deposit entrusted to you.



¹[Jesus] said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! ²It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. ³Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, ⁴and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."

⁵The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" ⁶And the Lord said, "If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"A Triad of Teachings"

TEXT: Luke 17:1-10 DATE: October 2, 2022 LITURGICAL DAY: 17th Sunday after Pentecost

THEME: Jesus' teachings about discipleship focus on three things: Staying out of the way of the Gospel, Faith, and Service.

- I. Staying out of the way of the Gospel means not impeding the work of God and the forgiveness which comes through His Word.
 - II. God adds to our faith by proclaiming the greatness and benefit of it.
 - III. Service is a thankless task done in humility.

CONCLUSION: As we approach Reformation Day, we give thanks for disciples such as Martin Luther who let the Gospel have free course in faith and service. Our Lutheran confessions in the Book of Concord were written in both German and Latin. So, it isn't surprising Dr. Luther's last words were a mix of both languages when he wrote these humble words: Wir sind alle Bettler. Hoc est verum. "We are all beggars. This is true." Thanks be to God we aren't beggars with empty hands. Our hands grasp by faith all the heavenly riches God has given to us by the death and resurrection of the most humble and faithful servant, Jesus Christ our Lord. To Him be glory forever. Amen.

If you are visiting, please speak to the Elder of the day, or to the Pastor about receiving the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.


ATTENDANCE AND COMMUNION REGISTRATION:

THE THEME VERSES FOR 2022:

(Romans 8:31-39)

"What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died--more than that, who was raised--who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins. **Amen.**


Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins.
