Holy Gospel Luke 18:9–17

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. _____, the _____ chapter.
- C Glory to You, O Lord.

⁹[Jesus] also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt: ¹⁰"Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹²I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.' ¹³But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' ¹⁴I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. 

TEXT: Luke 18:9-17 DATE: October 23, 2022 LITURGICAL DAY: 20th Sunday after Pentecost

THEME: God exalts the humble.

- I. Men who exalt themselves will see humility.
- II. God justifies sinners who pray for mercy.
- III. Jesus exalts the humble and helpless by touching them with water and word in Baptism.


Service of the Sacrament



Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins.


