



Epistle Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.


²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.



Holy Gospel John 8:31–36



TEXT: Romans 3:19-28; John 8:31-36 DATE: Oct. 27, 2024

<u>Theme</u>: Salvation comes to all who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and are justified freely by His grace!

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF REFORMATION DAY:

With his October 31st posting of the 95 Theses on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany in 1517, Martin Luther began a movement which he could have never imagined would result in a split from the Roman Catholic Church. We will celebrate this event here on Sunday Oct. 27th this year.

Luther wrote that **the entire Christian life is one of repentance** and that no papal indulgences could purchase anyone's soul from hell and purgatory. He was questioning the Pope's authority, a very dangerous proposition in his day.

As we have learned, Luther directed the Church back to **the written Scripture in the Old and New Testament** as the inspired Word of God. Here alone can Christians know for certain what God's truth is. Here alone can we say, "Thus saith the Lord!"

In addition, that Scripture does not teach works righteousness (which Rome taught under an oppressive system of indulgences, penance and masses). Instead, **salvation is by grace alone through faith** in the once for all completed sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. Luther discovered this essential truth in the Book of Romans. Or we should say, this truth discovered him!





Amen.


