TEXT: Matthew 25:31-46
DATE: 11-26-23 LITURGICAL DAY: Last Sunday of the Church Year *THEME:*

As the Church Year comes to its culmination today, we rejoice in the eternal life we have through faith in Jesus Christ. We inherit the kingdom prepared for us from the foundation of the world!

I. THE SON OF MAN- THE GOOD SHEPHERD COMES IN HIS GLORY

II. THE GOATS, THE UNBELIEVERS ON HIS LEFT

III. THE SHEEP, THE BELIEVERS ON HIS RIGHT

CONCLUSION:
