Luke 19:28–40


I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

TEXT: Luke 19:28-40 DATE: 12-1-24 LITURGICAL DAY: 1<u>st Sunday</u> in Advent Theme: Our Lord of Life rode on a donkey, an animal of humility, to become our righteousness on the cross

CONCLUSION:

The season of Advent focuses on the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. This first Sunday establishes this theme for the rest of the season. Jesus our Lord rode on a lowly donkey, an animal not of kings, but of laborers. He rode into Jerusalem to become our righteousness. Though He rode on a donkey, He was hailed as a king, placed the front as a triumphant king would. Such a paradox still happens today. Christ still comes to us, condescending Himself by presenting Himself on the altar for us to eat and to drink. His own Spirit is sent out from the mouth of the preacher. All this He does so that He *"may make us increase and abound in love for one another… blameless in holiness before our God and Father."*
