TEXT: Mark 1:1-8    DATE: 12-10-23  
LITURGICAL DAY: Second Sunday in Advent

*Theme: God’s prophets and apostles in both the Old and New Testament call us to daily repentance in preparation for the coming of our Lord and King.*

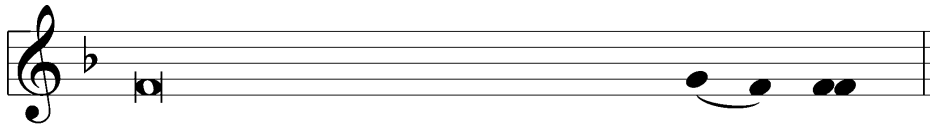
**P** As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord’s death until He comes.
