¹⁹And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ²¹And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ²²So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ²³He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."

²⁴(Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ²⁵They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ²⁶John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, ²⁷even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Sermon

"Jesus the Light That Comes into the World" TEXT: John 1:6-8, 19-28

Intro: Today, we celebrate the third Sunday in Advent. We are approaching the great celebration of Christmas when we will commemorate the incarnation of our Lord. And today's readings help to draw our attention to the expectation we have in the coming Christ, who brought and will bring light into the world. This light that has come into the world is the light that God revealed to the prophets, the light that Isaiah saw would come, as we read in Isaiah 9, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone."

Today's gospel introduces us to a man named John, who functions as the bridge between the Old and New Testament. The Old Testament prophets were awaiting the day when Christ would enter the world. St. John the Baptist bore "witness" to that very same light that had entered the world at the incarnation of Christ. And we, as Christians, also bear witness to Jesus, who is the light of the world. We await His second advent when the darkness of sin and death will be completely destroyed.

We will see the reality of Jesus being the light of the world in three main ways:

- 1. Humanity sits in the darkness of sin and death. (Isaiah 9:1-2, 61:1).
- 2. John testified to one who comes to bring light and life to the world (John 1:6-8, 23).
- 3. We look to Jesus, who brings us light, life, and the Lord's favor (Is 61:2; John 1:7).

Conclusion: When sin was as dark as could be, and humanity sat in darkness, Jesus came into the world and "was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary," so that He could cast away the darkness of our sin, and proclaim the "year of the Lord's favor." Now the Church, like John the Baptist, proclaims the message of Christ to the world. We proclaim that the light of Christ has entered the world, and "the darkness has not overcome it." Christ has already "proclaimed liberty to the captives" and opened the "prison to those who are bound." Christ brought His light into the world and liberated His Christians through His incarnation, death, and resurrection from the grave. But we await the day when Christ will come again and bring us into His kingdom.






Service of the Sacrament




The Words of Our Lord

Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins. **Amen.**


Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins.

C Amen.




