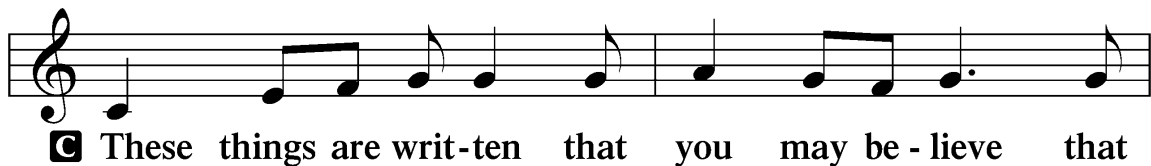

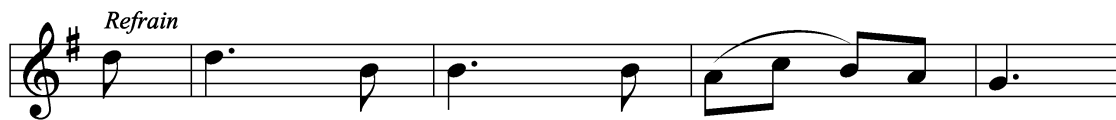

CONCLUSION:
