



and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.


He suffered and was buried.

Sermon

TITLE OF THE SERMON:

TEXT: Matthew 2:13-23 / Galatians 4:4-7 DATE: 12-28-25 LITURGICAL DAY: First Sunday after Christmas Also commemorate "The Holy Innocents, Martrys" – Dec. 28 *Theme: Jesus was part of a human family*
