THE FIRST ONE-SIDED COVENANT

GENESIS 8:1 - 9:29

GENESIS 8:1-5

- 1 "God made a wind blow over the earth"- Gen 1:2
- 4 "mountains of Ararat"- North of Mesopotamia, Eastern edge of modern Turkey

GENESIS 8:6-12

- 7 "sent forth a rave"- a scavenger bird, possibly looking for dead animals and people
- 8 "sent forth a dove"- looking for a place to land. Matt 3:13-17
- 10 "waited another seven days"- the time of creation, the time of getting on the ark
- 11 "olive leaf"- grows at lower altitudes, the land is ready to sustain life
- 12 "another seven days"- by now, we've caught the significance of this interval: Creation!

GENESIS 8:13-19

- 14 -total time = 1 year, 11 days
- 15-17 -God's orders mirror the embarking
 - "be fruitful and multiply on the earth" = Genesis 1:22
- 19 "went out by families"- Let's return to our discussion from Genesis 2 = Family.

GENESIS 8:20-22


- 20 -Altar Sacrifices of animals- remember Cain and Abel!
- 21 "pleasing aroma"- Deeds or Faith? Eph 5:2
 - "I will never again curse the ground"- Gen 3:17 + The Flood
 - "the intention of man's heart is evil from his youth"- The Flood punished Evil Doers (Actual Sin), but <u>concupiscence</u>, the natural inclination toward sin, still resides in the hearts of Noah, his wife, children, and daughters-in-law (Original Sin). These 8 saved individuals are referred to both as Righteous and having every intention of their hearts as evil = simul Justus et pecator
- -the work of the earth shall continue until the Day of Judgment (2 Peter 3:7) "shall not cease"- the verb for Sabbath!

GENESIS 9:1-7

- 1, 7 "Be fruitful and multiply"- Genesis 1:28
- 2 A Post-Fall way of saying "have dominion over it" (Gen 1:28)
- 3 "Every moving thing that lives shall be food for you"- we're no longer Vegetarians
- 4 "But you shall not eat..." dietary laws are put in place that will be expanded in Lev. 11
- 5 "For your lifeblood"- for murder
- 6 God does use human courts and rulers to carry out His punishments. Rom 13:3-4
- Once in Genesis and twice after the flood man is <u>blessed</u> and told "be fruitful and multiply." Yet our society looks down on families with many children. Your thoughts: Does this blessing/command still apply today or is the earth too full? How should our view of family be shaped by what we've seen in early Genesis?

GENESIS 9:8-17

9 "I establish my covenant"- What is a covenant? Intro to Covenant Theology "with you and your offspring after you"- God's promises are multi-generational, even *foreseeing* future recipients of the promise.



- 11 "cut off"- this is the word for making a covenant- "to cut a covenant"
- -God attaches His promise to a visible sign; Gen 3:15, 4:15, here, and more to come! "for all future generations"- the promise/sign transcends time and culture, it is objective!
- 13 "I have set my bow in the cloud"- it may not have existed yet or it may have
- 15-17 -Vicar's quotation conundrum!
- "everlasting covenant"- but this world will not last forever, the sign speaks of God's eternal mercy and protection of His People- Rev. 4:3; 10:1

GENESIS 9:18-29

- 19 "from these the people of the whole earth were dispersed"- setting up Ch 10 "The Table of Nations"
- 20-21 The Downfall of the Righteous Man- grows wine and gets drunk
- "the father of Canaan"- Gen 10:6, given Hebrew narrative style, Canaan and his brothers are likely already born "saw the nakedness of his father"- shameful yet even more shameful was telling his brothers. May mean even more took place Lev. 18 (especially 3, 6-7, 24-25)
- 24 "knew what his youngest son had done to him" how did he know? What was done? Makes more sense given Lev. 18
- 25-27 "cursed IS Canaan"- Gen 3:17; 4:11 God curses. Here it is Noah cursing Ham's son, not Ham. "Canaan" comes from the Hebrew for stooping/ submitting. WHY?

PSALM 50

M: ¹The Mighty One, God YHWH,

W: speaks and summons the earth

M: from the rising of the sun to its setting.

W: ²Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty,

M: God shines forth.

W: ³Our God comes; he does not keep silence;

M: before him is a devouring fire,

W: around him a mighty tempest.

M: ⁴He calls to the heavens above

W: and to the earth, that he may judge his people:

ALL: 5"Gather to me my faithful ones, who made a covenant with me by sacrifice!"

M: ⁶The heavens declare his righteousness,

W: for God himself is judge!

M: ⁷"Hear, O my people, and I will speak;

W: O Israel, I will testify against you.

M: I am God, your God.

W: 8Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you;

M: your burnt offerings are continually before me.

W: 9I will not accept a bull from your house

M: or goats from your folds.

W: ¹⁰For every beast of the forest is mine,

M: the cattle on a thousand hills.

W: ¹¹I know all the birds of the hills,

M: and all that moves in the field is mine.

W: 12"If I were hungry, I would not tell you,

M: for the world and its fullness are mine.

W: ¹³Do I eat the flesh of bulls

M: or drink the blood of goats?

W: 14Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving,

M: and perform your vows to the Most High,

W: ¹⁵ and call upon me in the day of trouble;

M: I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me."

W: ¹⁶But to the wicked God says:

M: "What right have you to recite my statutes

W: or take my covenant on your lips?

M: ¹⁷For you hate discipline,

W: and you cast my words behind you.

M: ¹⁸If you see a thief, you are pleased with him,

W: and you keep company with adulterers.

M: ¹⁹"You give your mouth free rein for evil,

W: and your tongue frames deceit.

M: ²⁰You sit and speak against your brother;

W: you slander your own mother's son.

M: ²¹These things you have done, and I have been silent;

W: you thought that I was one like yourself.

M: But now I rebuke you and lay the charge before you.

W: ²²"Mark this, then, you who forget God,

M: lest I tear you apart, and there be none to deliver!

W: ²³The one who offers thanksgiving as his sacrifice glorifies me;

M: to one who orders his way rightly

W: I will show the salvation of God!"

ALL: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever, amen.
