## "It is NOT good that ..."



Text: Genesis 2:18-25

2:18-20-<sup>18</sup>Then YHWH God said, "It is NOT GOOD that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper <u>complimentary to</u> him." <sup>19</sup>Now out of the ground YHWH God had formed every beast of the field and every bird of the heavens and brought them to the man to see what he would call them. And whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. <sup>20</sup>The man gave names to all livestock and to the birds of the heavens and to every beast of the field. But for <u>the man</u> there was not found a helper <u>complimentary to</u> him. (VMT)

- v. 18- "it is NOT good"- seven times in Genesis 1, God says creation is good (1:4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25, 31). In between 1:25 and 1:31 Genesis 2 occurs and we get the first and only NOT GOOD!
  It is not moral evil... it is incompleteness that God says is Not Good!
  - "I will make a helper..." NOT a slave, punching bag, battle axe, ball & chain.
- v. 19- "YHWH God had formed every beast of the field and every bird of the heavens and brought them to the man to see what he would call them"
  - + Why does the man get to name the animals? (Gen 1:28)
  - + If naming someone is a sign of authority, what does that say about how we are named? - Matt 28:19-20, Acts 4:12
  - Were the dinosaurs around for this?
    - Job 40:14 41:34
- v. 20- no helper was found... SO...

2:21-22 So YHWH God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and while he slept took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. <sup>22</sup>And the rib that the LORD God had taken from the man he <u>built</u> into a <u>bride</u> and brought her to the man.

v. 21-22 -"took one of his ribs" Why the rib?? Talmud says, God did not take woman from man's foot to be walked on, nor his head to be higher; but from the side to be equal, under the arm to be protected, and next to the heart to be loved.

+What other *bride* is *built* from the pierced side of a man???

- "built into a bride" Luther explains just how a wife is the "building" of her husband.
  - 1. She is the dwelling that he returns to
  - 2. He is to defend her, strengthen her, and build her up
  - 3. The wife is where the children are raised

2:23-25<sup>23</sup>Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called <u>Bride</u>, because she was taken out of Bridegroom."

<sup>24</sup>*Therefore a <u>bridegroom</u> shall leave his father and his mother and <u>cling</u> to his <u>bride</u>, and they shall become one flesh. <sup>25</sup><i>And the man and his <u>bride</u> were both naked and were not ashamed. (VMT)* 

- This is the most important VMT distinction we will see!! Note the different vocabulary!!

- Would this vocabulary influence modern discussions of marriage and women's rights?

- "they shall become one flesh" – What does this mean? (Don't be shy about answering)

CREATION	NEW CREATION
The man is put into a deep sleep	The New Man (Christ) is put to death
His side is opened	His side is pierced (Jn 19:34)
Out comes a rib	Out comes blood and water
The rib is built into the bride for man	The blood & water (LS, Bapt.) are built into Church
God presents the bride to man	The Church is presented to Christ as a bride
Bridegroom and Bride become one flesh	The Church is united to Christ
Bridegroom and Bride produce sons of man	Christ and Church produce sons of God

Jesus Christ is the New "man" – Rom. 5:12-21

Jesus is the Bridegroom – Matt. 9:15, 25:1-13, John 3:29

The Church is the Bride of Christ! - 2 Cor. 11:2 Eph. 5:31-32, Rev. 19:7, 21:2, 9-14

The Church and Christ become "one flesh" – Rom 12:5, 1 Cor 10:16, 12:12-13, Gal 3:28, Eph 4:1-16, 5:29

Christ works in His Bride through His Holy Spirit to produce sons of God- Luke 20:36, John 3:5, Rom 8:14, Gal 3:26, 1 Peter 1:22-23, 1 John 5:1-5
