Principles of an AUTHORized Interpretation

- 1- Scripture interprets Scripture \rightarrow The simple texts help interpret the difficult texts (not vice versa)
- 2- The Rule of the Faith (cannot come up with an interpretation that disagrees with this)
- 3- Jesus Christ is the center of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation
- 4- Different literary genres require different readings: Letters, poetry, prophecy, Apocalyptic
- 5- Understanding literal, symbolic and apocalyptic forms of speech
- 6- The use of the Old Testament to understand the meaning of numbers/symbols in the New Testament (saturated with the language and content of the Old Testament and apocalyptic imagery)
- 7- The intended meaning by the inspired author is the proper interpretation
 - +Eschatology, end-times are now: from Jesus' ascension till his return
 - +Revelation cannot be put into a neat chronological order
 - +Context is crucial- verse- paragraph- chapter- book
- 8- The proper distinction between Law and Gospel
- 9- The new Israel from Romans chapter 9-11 is the Christian Church Jewish and Gentile
- 10- Humility when we don't know what a verse means, admit it and move on to the next verse!

Basic Info

Writer: the Apostle John (1:1,4, 9; 22:8), the son of Zebedee (Mt. 10:2)

The date: 95 A.D. the latter part of the emperor Domitian's reign (81-96 A.D.)

The occasion: The Christians were being pressured to give in to the cult of emperor worship-

they would only say, "Jesus is Lord" NOT Caesar is Lord.

The purpose: Satan tries to destroy the Church, but Christ's and the Church's victory is assured.

The nature of apocalyptic literature: Highly symbolic (1:20; 17:1,5,18; 21:9-10)

The symbolism of numbers: 7 = reunion with God in his covenant of grace - Sabbath rest

(3=The Triune God 4=the world 3+4=7)

3 ½ = evil forces opposing the church, broken covenant, half of 7

10 and its cube- $1000 (10 \times 10 \times 10) = \text{completeness}$

12 = the church in the OT and NT

Franzmann To understand the symbols in Revelation, one must go through at least 3 "doors": 1. The gospel of Christ and him crucified. 2. The Old Testament [especially Daniel, Ezekiel, and Zechariah]. 3. Some knowledge of the 1st century life of the church in the pagan Roman empire. pp. 25-27 All through the book, note the use of Jesus as the LAMB which connects us to Isaiah 53 and also to Exodus 12 the paschal passover lamb. pp. 19,20
