"Wisdom and the Fear of the Lord: Proverbs as a Book on Faith" Week 16: Proverbs 22:17-24:22, "The Wisdom of Amenemope and Other Wise Men"

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| 1. The author for most of this book is Solomon (see Pr. 1:1). On occasion other Wise Men's |
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| sayings are included. Who are they? Read Pr. 30:1 and 31:1. |
| 2. Solomon took much of his material for Pr. 22:17-23:14 from an Egyptian wisdom document called, "The Wisdom of Amenemope." Although parallels exist, and it is probably cited as "thirty sayings" (22:20), how does Solomon himself address the gathering of knowledge and wisdom from worldly sources? Read Prov. 1:5-6. |
| 3. Where perhaps was Solomon introduced to this writing? Read 1 Kings 3:1 and 4:29-30. |
| 4. What is the new context that Solomon fits these verses into? Whose wisdom does Solomon seek to proclaim? Read Prov. 22:17-21. |
| II. Proverbs 22:22-23:14, "Advice for Living with Your Neighbor" 5. What is God's promise for those who have no help in this world? (22:22-23) |
| 6. What would we call the crime mentioned in v. 28? |
| 7. How should one be wary of the rich food on a ruler's table? What are his intentions? (23:1-3) |
| 8. How should we regard wealth and our toil in this world? |

9. What is the goal of discipline? How does Solomon bring out the "tough love" of a parent elsewhere? Read Prov. 13:24.

III. Proverbs 23:15-24:22, "Advice from Your Father"

- 10. The sayings from Amenemope have ended, and proverbs from other Wise Men follow here, in the form of a father's advice to his son. What is the tone of the father, and what is his hope for his child?
- 11. How can this instruct us as we live out our various vocations?
- 12. Martin Luther spoke highly of education, saying, "You parents can provide your children with no greater gift than an education in the liberal arts." How does he echo Prov. 23:23?
- 13. What vices and their consequences are described in the latter half of chapter 23?
- 14. A house is often a metaphor for one's life. How should one go about establishing his life?
- 15. How must we guard ourselves against evil which is touted as good in our society? (24:11-12) Which of Jesus' parables does this remind you of?
